SCHEDULE

All exhibits to be staged between **8.00am** and **10.15am** on the morning of the Show and removed between **5.15pm** and **5.30pm**.

Note: Names of varieties of flowers, fruit and vegetables would be welcome if known.

SECTION A: VEGETABLES AND FRUIT

1. Six shallots.
2. Four onions, under 7.5cm circumference, lightly trimmed.
3. Four onions, over 7.5cm circumference, lightly trimmed.
4. Four potatoes, white.
5. Four potatoes, coloured.
6. Six French beans.
7. Six runner beans.
8. Longest runner bean.
9. Three carrots, washed but not scrubbed or trimmed.
10. Four apples, cooking.
11. Four apples, dessert.
12. Four pears.
13. Four plums.
14. A saucer of soft fruit, any variety.
15. Five tomatoes with calyces attached.
16. Five tomatoes, small fruited and cherry cultivars, with calyces attached.
17. A pair of cucumbers.
18. Three beetroot, washed but not scrubbed or trimmed.
19. Three parsnips, washed but not scrubbed or trimmed.
20. Pair of marrow or large courgettes.
21. Container of fresh culinary herbs (up to five named varieties) in water.
22. Three courgettes, 15cm or less in length.
23. Tray of four distinct vegetables, two of each variety, 38cm x 51cm overall, to be judged on quality. Vegetables to be trimmed to fit tray. (Prizes £2, £1, 50p)

SECTION B: JUNIOR VEGETABLES

(Two classes: 10 years and under; and 11 – 16 years)

24. Potatoes grown in plastic bucket, bucket to be supplied by Horticultural Society. To be judged on weight of potatoes. (10 years and under)
25. Potatoes grown in plastic bucket, bucket to be supplied by Horticultural Society. To be judged on weight of potatoes. (age 11 – 16 years)

On day of Show, bring your bucket to the Marquee between 8.00am and 10.30am with the potato plant still growing in it, where it will be emptied and then the potatoes will be weighed. The Judge's decision is final.

SECTION C: FLOWERS

26. Pot plant, flowering.
27. Pot plant, foliage.
28. Pot grown fuchsia.
29. Container of mixed hardy perennials, 6 stems.
30. Container of scented flowers, 6 stems.
31. Container of mixed flowers, 6 stems.

35. Container of sweet peas, 6 stems.
36. Container of dahlias, 3 decorative.
37. Container of dahlias, 3 cactus.
38. Container of dahlias, 3 of any other type.

40. Container of mixed foliage, maximum width 30.5cm.
41. Three sprays of rose hips.
42. Collection of hosta leaves.
43. One clematis bloom in a saucer.

SECTION D: FLORAL ART

Any exhibit which is not according to Schedule will be disqualified.
Height unlimited in all classes

44. Arrangement of five blooms and any foliage. Space allowed 61cm.
45. Green arrangement. Can contain berries Space allowed 61cm.
46. Harvest time. Space allowed 61cm.
47. Petite arrangement in any container. 10cm x 23cm overall

SECTION E: COOKERY

Note: **Jam jars** should be shiny and clean and should not have trademarks. **All food** should be protected with cling film.

48. Jar of marmalade.
49. Jar of blackcurrant jam.
50. Jar of raspberry jam.
51. Jar of jelly.
52. Jar of chutney.
53. Victoria sandwich. Own recipe.
54. Four chocolate brownies. Own recipe.
55. Lemon meringue pie. Own recipe.
56. Fruit cake. Recipe: 4oz margarine, 2 eggs, 4oz caster sugar, 8 oz SR flour, 8oz mixed fruit, ¼ teaspoons salt, 1/8 pint milk, grated rind of orange. Cream fat & sugar. Add eggs one at a time + 1 tblspn flour. Add milk (& a little flour), beating in between. Stir in fruit, grated rind & rest of flour. Bake in 7" lined cake tin in oven 160 C approx 1¼ hours.

SECTION H: ART

66. Painting or drawing, any medium.

SECTION I: PHOTOGRAPHS

68. **“Flower(s) in close up”**. An image of any flower(s) between magnifications of one tenth and ten. There is no restriction on arrangement, lighting or habitat, but a holding device should not be shown.

69. **“Reflections”**. An image in which the reflections of a subject provide the centre of interest. They may be produced by water, windows, metal, etc.

70. **“Steps or Stairs”**. An image featuring steps or stairs either indoors or outdoors.

71. **“Swimming Lessons”**.

72. **“Caught in the Act”**. An image showing a featured subject doing something surreptitiously. It may be spontaneous or contrived but will obviously fare better if it looks natural. (**age 16 or under**)

Note: All photographs to be taken by exhibitor and to be unmounted and not exceed 13cm x 18cm. Could exhibitor please put their name on the back of each photograph to avoid any possible confusion.

SECTION J: CHILDREN'S CLASSES (under 8 years old)

73. **Butterfly** made from scrap materials.
Maximum size 30cm x 30cm x 30cm high.

- 74. **Handwriting.** Poem “Kite” to be copied in ballpoint pen or pencil on plain paper. Script or joined up writing, illustrated if possible. Maximum size 21cm x 30cm
- 75. **Pasta picture on a paper plate.**
- 76. **Anything you have made.**
- 77. **Miniature garden in a shoe box.**
Not more than 20cm overall.

SECTION K: CHILDREN’S CLASSES (8 to 12 years old)

- 78. **Famous building** made from scrap materials, building to be named. Maximum size 30cm x 30cm x 50cm high
- 79. **Handwriting.** Poem “An Attempt at Unrhymed Verse” to be copied in ballpoint pen or pencil on plain paper. Script or joined up writing, illustrated if possible. Maximum size 21cm x 30cm
- 80. **Mosaic picture** made from scraps of paper from a colour magazine.
- 81. **Anything you have made.**
- 82. **Arrangement of garden flowers** in any container. Not more than 20cm overall.

Note: In Sections J and K, age to be stated on entry form and exhibitor’s card. Could parents please ensure that maximum sizes above are not exceeded.

RULES FOR COMPETITORS

1. Entry fee: Adults – 25p per entry Children – 10p per entry
2. The Secretary will be at the **Red Lion** to receive entries on **Friday 27th August, from 7.00pm to 8.30pm**. Entries may be sent to the Secretary at Park Cottage, Campden Hill, Ilmington
3. All exhibits to be staged between **8.00am** and **10.15am** on the morning of the Show. Exhibits must not be removed before **5.15pm**, but must be removed by **5.30pm**. The Committee cannot take responsibility for any exhibits not collected from the tent.
4. All exhibits in Sections A and C must be grown in the exhibitor's garden. The Committee reserve the right to inspect gardens of exhibitors.
5. The tent must be cleared by **10.30am** on the morning of the Show when judging will commence.
6. Any objection must be made in writing to the Secretary before prize giving. Prizes may then be withheld pending enquiries.
7. Any exhibitor may enter any number of exhibits in a class but may not receive more than one prize in a class.
8. The decision of the judges shall be final.
9. While every care will be taken, the Committee cannot accept responsibility for any damage or loss which may occur.
10. Could cup winners please ensure that cups are covered by their home insurance.

TROPHIES

1. Royal Horticultural Society's **Banksian Medal** will be awarded to the winner of the largest total amount of money in prizes in the whole of the horticultural classes. The competitors who won the Banksian Medal in 2008 or 2009 are not eligible to win this medal.
2. The **Spenser Flower Challenge Cup** for most points overall.
3. The **Ilmington Village Challenge Cup** for the most points in Sections A and C. Ilmington residents only.
4. The **1965 Challenge Cup** for the most points in Sections A and C. Non Parish residents only.
5. A **Challenge Cup** for the best exhibit of flowers in the Show (Section C).

6. The **Jubilee Cup** for the best exhibit in the vegetable & fruit classes (Section A)
7. The **Bertie Wyton Trophy** for the best exhibit in Section A. Ilmington residents only.
8. The **Woodland Pottery Trophy** for the best exhibit in Section C. Ilmington residents only.
9. The **Christine Marland Cup** for the best exhibit in the Rose classes.
10. The **Esmee Lace-Williams Cup** will be awarded to the member of the Ilmington Wednesday Club with the most points in the Show.
11. The **Hersey Flower Trophy** for the most points in Section D.
12. The **Ladies Challenge Rose Bowl** for the most points in Sections E and G.
